IT FLIES! Bleriot

The picture below is a photo of an airplane, of sorts, that flew across the English Channel in 1909 (the Wright Bros first flew in 1903). Can you imagine being out of sight of land over the channel sitting on this thing?! I saw it fly (a little above the ground for the length of a football field) at the Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome in New York this past summer.



Now that was a shaky flight ! The pilot sits up on top as you can see and power is controlled by turning the ignition on and off as the motor rotates---engine roars, dead quiet, roars, sputter, pop, etc. Note the wing warping instead of ailerons. I was joined by MDPA members Jim and Dale Blodgett who happened to be visiting the Aerodrome also.

The complementary Continental Breakfast was abundantly full of calories as is normal for our monthly servings, but not in the normal form of eggs, grits, biscuits with gravy and sausage. We had "Costco's Best" in muffins and "Danish." The leftover went to the Tower--- we could probably have gotten any runway we wanted, even to take off backwards if we wanted!

I had to pinch-hit as the "Moderator of the Month," but I was ready! I had plenty of tidbits to throw out as discussion items since I had squirreled them away for just an occasion. Natasha Lantsov, our 2013 trip and fly-out coordinator, solicited input from the pilots on trips for the year.

We started off with a reading of a message from a young 5th grader who thought that it would be a fun job to be a pilot but that there were challenges, like getting airsick. We commented on another young 3rd grade boy's thoughts of flight as reflected in his report titled "Information Book about Flying Airplanes." This document was published in our November newsletter and was a direct result of a flight that Richard Roberts gave the boy's family when we visited Half Moon Bay on a fly-out this last Summer.

The recent NTSB issuance of a letter to the FAA in regards to the high accident rate of experimental aircraft over a 6 year period was seen as causing spiraling insurance rates for these aircraft thus forcing many to simply self-insure.

A report from the UK was brought up that addressed the potential destructive effects of "flutter" of aircraft appendages such as elevators and wings. The take-away from this discussion was that pilots must be very aware of limitations of their aircraft when pulling excessive "g" forces during severe maneuvering.

We wrapped up the session with a presentation on the merit of keeping the "Chicken Strip" open (Saline Valley WNW of Death Valley). It is a rock airstrip in the middle of a bowl which is near a oasis with thermal springs. the only access is by a 4 hour 4 wheel drive or by air. It was observed that people there wear all the same skin colored uniform.
